

Curriculum 18 mos. &Two's

Our Bible curriculum is **Discipleland**. Activities, play acting, math and art projects are used to retell these stories and help the children retain the stories and the lessons within. Once a week the children meet together for morning Chapel, which includes singing, a Bible lesson and prayer before they go to their class. Parents are encouraged to join us for our Chapel time.

Our Two year olds will be introduced to letters and sounds through a variety of activities and methods for learning basic skills. These activities capture the attention and appropriately address the learning styles of children. The following concepts are incorporated throughout the child's learning activities:

Count on Math is our basic math curriculum for our 2 year olds. This is a developmental approach that allows children to build on their understanding in a logical sequence. Count On Math offers hands-on, concrete experiences that give children opportunities to experiment with and to internalize new concepts. All concepts are presented in an age appropriate level. Concepts introduced may include:

- □ Recognition of similarities and differences
- Classification
- Pattern recognition
- One-to-one relationships
- Comparison of sets

Literature: Children are exposed to a reading experience several times each day to give them a chance to experience a variety of stories. Some stories are retold several times to bring the story to life for the child. Our goal in literature exposure is to foster a love of reading in each child.

Saxon is our math curriculum. It is a hands-on approach to learning math concepts.

Four year olds will be *introduced* but not limited to:

- count forward orally and on a number line
- count with one-to-one correspondence
- count by 1's and 10's
- compare and order numbers • and objects
- identify, match, and divide • sets
- identify ordinal position to fourth
- act out for addition and subtraction stories

- know a symbol can stand for a missing number in a sentence
- identify and count pennies and dimes
- write money amounts using cent symbol (¢)
- write numerals to 20 •
- identify right and left and use other positional words and phrases
- identify, sort, and compare geometric shapes and solids
- identify line of symmetry and create symmetrical designs

- sort and identify sorting rule
- identify and extend patterns
- graph real objects and pictures
- tell and show time to the hour
- use a calendar and identify its parts
- compare, order, and measure using standard and nonstandard units
- describe likelihood of an event
